



Marijuana Poll Results

POLLING METHODOLOGY

For this poll, a sample of likely households was chosen from the population registered to vote in the state of Louisiana for a “hybrid” automated (for landlines)/text (for cell phones) poll, where 27% of the phone numbers were landlines and 73% of the phone numbers were cell phones. There were 1,160 completed responses.

The survey was conducted March 22-23. The margin of error, with a 95% confidence interval, was 2.9%. The demographic breakdown of the respondents was 66-29% white/black (5% “other”), while the party registration of respondents was 42-35% Democratic/Republican (23% Independents). The geographic breakdown of the respondents was as follows: 5% from Alexandria, 20% from Baton Rouge, 13% from Lafayette, 5% from Lake Charles, 9% from Monroe, 36% from New Orleans, and 13% from Shreveport (*The explanation of the boundaries of these regions is graphically depicted in Exhibit A at the end of the poll analysis*).

Question 1: In general, how would you describe your position on permissible usage of marijuana?

SUMMARY

JMC Analytics and Polling was commissioned to conduct this poll for the Louisiana Association for Therapeutic Alternatives (LATA). There are three main takeaways from this poll: (1) public opinion about marijuana usage remains noticeably more favorable (with favorable trending relative to the 2020 poll) than Louisiana's existing marijuana laws would suggest is the case, (2) public opinion about marijuana usage is strongly supportive across nearly all of the demographic and political spectrum, and (3) any differences of opinion about marijuana usage are driven by the age of the respondent.

Just like last year's poll, the strongest area of support was on the question of whether the marijuana plant (in addition to the oil) should be a permissible type of medical marijuana - an overwhelming 75-13% majority are in favor (compared to 69-15% last year). Similarly, on where people stand on what type of marijuana usage should be legal, 67% (a 13 point increase relative to last year) favor legalizing both medicinal and recreational use of marijuana, while only 8% (down four points from last year) favor keeping both illegal, and another 16% (down seven points from last year) favor only legalizing medicinal usage. The numbers aren't much different on the legality of possession: only 24% favor keeping possession illegal, while 68% oppose.

In general, there was broad agreement on marijuana usage, but the one demographic variable where opinion was noticeably less favorable was the age of the respondent: those 65 years old or over are much less likely to be supportive of marijuana than those younger than 65 years old.

In conclusion, substantial majorities (with favorable trends relative to last year's poll) across the board have a more favorable view about marijuana usage, whether the form of usage is medicinal or recreational.

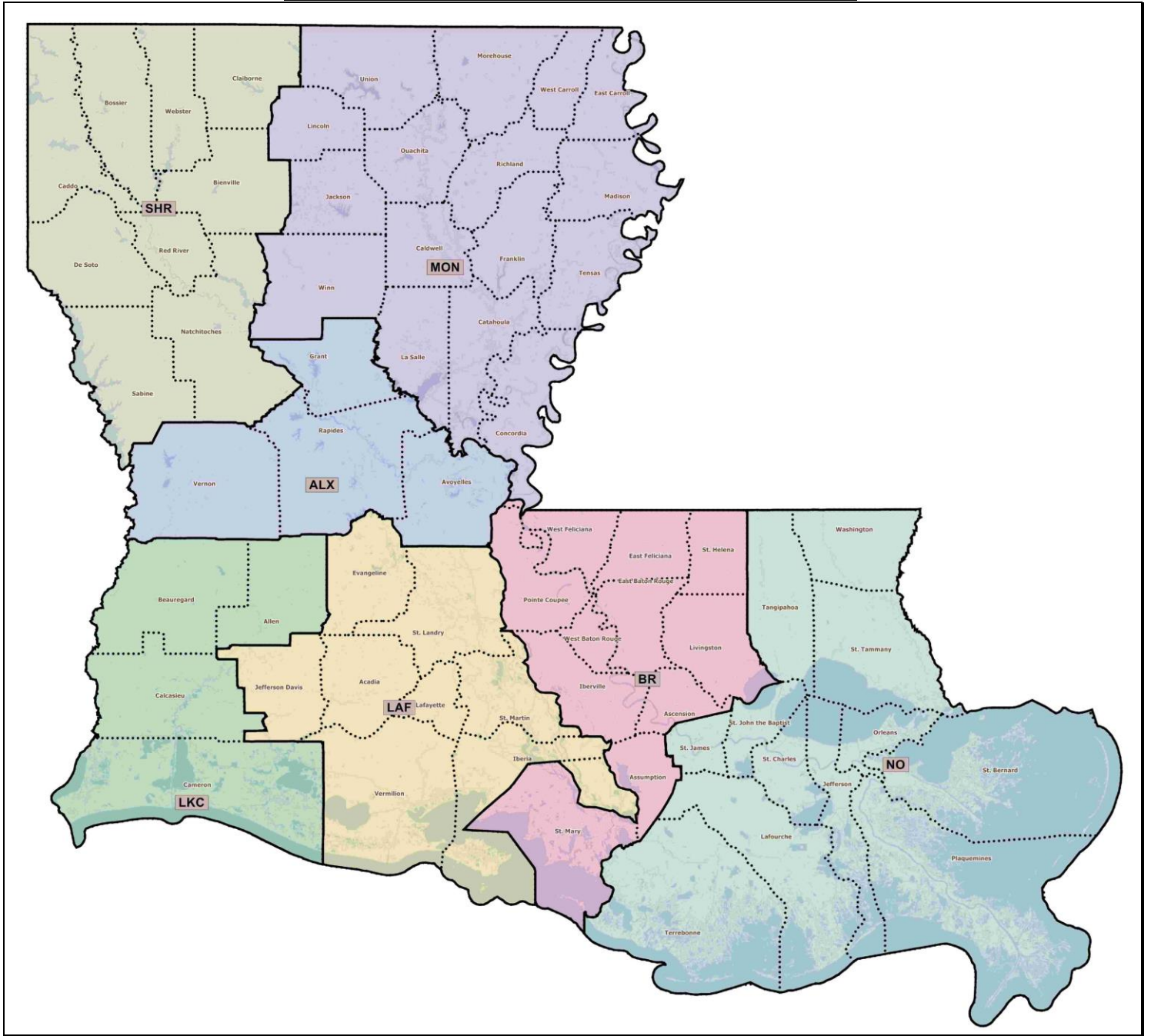
