



Virginia Statewide Poll Results

POLLING METHODOLOGY

- Likely voters, conducted June 9-12, 2021 (4.2% MOE with 95% confidence interval)
- Sample size: 550 (76% cell phones (texted), 24% landlines)
- Race/party: 69% white, 17% black, 14% "Other"/41% Democratic, 35% Republican, 23% Independents
- Gender: 53% female, 47% male
- <u>Geography (Nielsen media markets)</u>: DC Metro area: 39%, Hampton Roads area: 21%, Richmond area: 22%, western Virginia: 18% (*Graphically depicted in Exhibit A*).

SUMMARY

JMC Analytics and Polling was commissioned to conduct this poll for a group of private poll subscribers. There are three main takeaways from this poll: (1) Democrats have plurality leads in all three statewide races, (2) in the Governor's race, Terry McAuliffe's lead is within the statistical margin of error, (3) voters are even more closely divided right now on how they would vote in House of Delegates races.

Joe Biden carried Virginia by a comfortable 10-point margin in the 2020 Presidential election, and when examining the building blocks of his win, two constituencies are readily apparent as to where he performed unusually strongly: a 41-40% lead among those who consider themselves Independents, and a 58-35%/23-point lead among college graduates. It also didn't hurt that in the counties/independent cities within the Washington DC media market, Biden had a 59-30% poll lead.

Against that yardstick, Terry McAuliffe in the Governor's race does not attain those levels of support, even though he overall still has a four point/46-42% lead over Glenn Youngkin. In the Washington DC media market, McAuliffe only leads by 18 points (53-35%) over Youngkin, compared to Biden's 29 point lead. Similarly, McAuliffe has a 6 point lead (48-42%) over Youngkin among college graduates (Biden led by 23 points). And while Biden had a one-point (41-40%) lead among Independents, McAuliffe is underwater by 6 points (37-43%) among this demographic. Patterns of support similar McAuliffe's are seen in the Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General's races, where Democrats similarly have plurality leads.

This (compared to Biden) weakened performance is even more noticeable in a generic ballot question about House of Delegates races: a Biden poll lead of 8 points (while McAuliffe led by 4 points) is a near tie on House of Delegates races - Democrats only have a one-point lead. As with the Governor's race, Democrats are underperforming in the DC media market (only a 13-point/47-34% lead, which is less than half of Biden's lead), among college graduates (only a 5-point/46-41% lead), and Independents (Democrats are underwater by 15 points/24-39%, although it's also worth noting that 37% of this group are undecided).

In summary, Democrats start off with leads both in statewide and/or House of Delegates races, but it's not a secure lead, and there are noticeable signs of underperformance relative to President Biden's 2020 race.


