



Alabama US Senate Runoff Poll Results

POLLING METHODOLOGY

- Likely Republican runoff voters in Alabama, conducted June 6-9, 2022, 2022 (3.9% MOE with 95% confidence interval)
- Sample size: 630 (90% cell phones (texted), 10% landlines - “hybrid” poll)
- Race/party: 99% white, <1% black, <1% “Other”
- Gender: 51% male, 49% female
- Age Range: 4% 18-34 years old, 20% 35-54 years old, 25% 55-64 years old, 52% 65 years old and up
- Geography (Nielsen media market): Birmingham 41%, Dothan 5%, Huntsville 23%, Mobile 18%, and Montgomery 14% (*Explanation is graphically depicted in Exhibit A*).

POLL RESULTS

Question 1: Do you plan to vote in the Republican runoff election on June 21?

SUMMARY

JMC Analytics and Polling was commissioned to conduct this poll for private subscribers. There are four main takeaways from this poll: (1) Katie Britt has a double-digit lead in the poll with the runoff less than two weeks away, (2) a Trump endorsement would be most useful when paired with messaging about Mitch McConnell's support of Katie Britt, (3) attacking Mitch McConnell as a representative of the Republican Establishment does have some potency, and (4) this is an "economic issues election year."

In the primary, Katie Britt led the field 45-29%, and the poll results currently show that those supporting one of the "also rans" are breaking for Britt 47-41% if undecided "leaners" are included. Taken at face value, those two numbers would suggest a double-digit Britt win in the runoff if nothing changed between now and June 21.

However, a detailed examination of the data shows that Congressman Brooks has two (less obvious) advantages in a low turnout runoff: (1) among the most chronic voters, Brooks only trails 44-47% (within the statistical margin of error), and (2) voters at least 65 years old are more narrowly (48-42%) for Britt than the overall poll sample, which shows a 51-39% lead for Britt if undecided "leaners" are included.

Furthermore, a juxtaposition of Mitch McConnell's endorsement of Katie Britt against a hypothetical re-endorsement of "Mo" Brooks by former President Trump would result in a 15-point swing that would put Brooks narrowly in the lead (in other words, a 51-39% Britt lead becomes a 44-41% Brooks lead after this messaging is communicated).

Finally, inflation is the number one issue (leading with a 31% plurality), and this strong sentiment is shared across the board. Economic issues (at 21%) are the second most important issue, while election integrity (at 12%) is third.

In short, the Senate runoff race has "upset potential" if former President Trump were to re-endorse former Congressman Brooks.

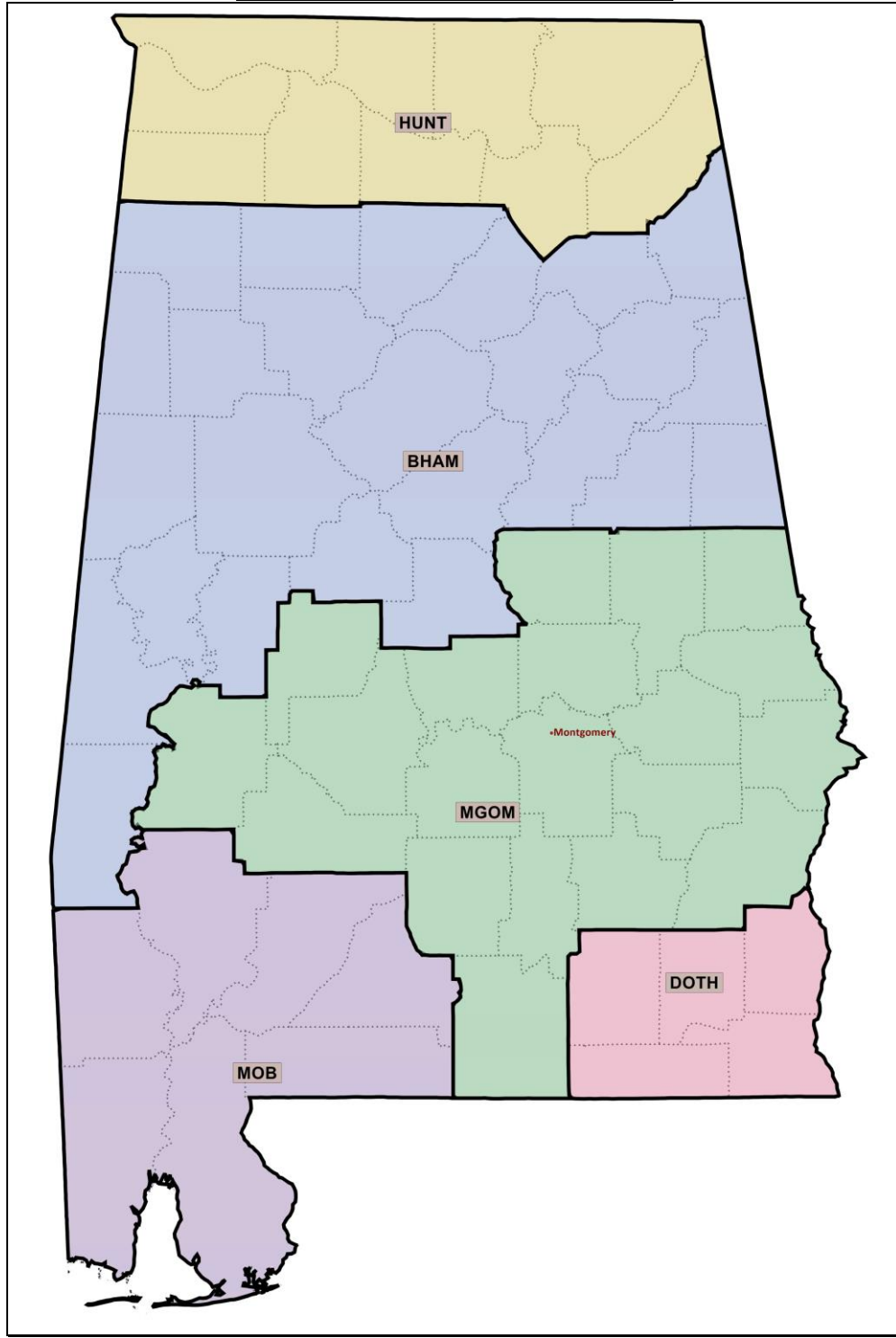
