



## Georgia Statewide Poll Results

### POLLING METHODOLOGY

- Likely GOP primary voters, conducted March 7-8, 2026, 2026 (4.1% MOE with 95% confidence interval)
- Sample size: 560 (78% cell phones (texted), 22% landlines/cell phones (live dialed) - “hybrid” poll)
- Race/party: 94% white, 4% black, 3% “Other”
- Geography (aggregated media markets): Atlanta (core): 8%, Atlanta (inner suburbs): 12%, Atlanta (suburbs): 23%, Central Georgia: 13%, North Georgia: 26%, South Georgia: 17% (*Explanation is graphically depicted in Exhibit A*)

**SUMMARY**

JMC Analytics and Polling was commissioned to conduct this poll for private subscribers. There are three main takeaways from this poll: (1) In the Republican primary for the governor’s race, healthcare executive Rick Jackson starts off with a wide lead over several incumbent statewide elected officials, (2) in the US Senate race, Representative Mike Collins has a similar wide lead, and (3) inflation/border security are by far the top issues among likely Republican primary voters.

In the Governor’s race, Rick Jackson starts off with a wide 37-22% lead over Lt Governor Burt Jones. While he leads across most demographic groups, his strongest numbers are among MAGA and Evangelical Republicans. Geographically, his strongest footprint is in the Atlanta suburbs/north/south Georgia, while Burt Jones has a narrow plurality in central Georgia, and Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger (whose approval rating is 43-40%) has a small lead in the core counties (Fulton, DeKalb, and Clayton) of the Atlanta media market. A modest 25% are undecided.

The US Senate race is a similar story; in this race, it’s Congressman Mike Collins with a wide (31-13%) lead over former football coach Derek Dooley and Congressman “Buddy” Carter (who is in third place with 11%). Collins leads across most demographic groups, with his strongest numbers among MAGA and Evangelical Republicans. He also leads across most of the state, except for South Georgia, which is Carter’s geographic base. A fairly high 43% are undecided.

Of the Republican elected officials whose approval ratings were tested, Governor Brian Kemp’s 82-15% approval rating is a bit higher than President Trump’s (79-18%). Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger has a 43-40% approval rating, which is most notable underwater (60-23%) among Trump/MAGA Republicans.

When asked about their most important issue, primary voters were statistically tied between inflation/the cost of living (27%) and border security/illegal immigration (25%). Border security is most important to Trump/MAGA Republicans (election integrity is a fairly close second among this demographic), while the cost of living is most important among almost every other type of Republican and/or Independent who might vote in the Republican primary.

In summary, both the Governor and Senate primary races begin with wide leads for Rick Jackson and Mike Collins. The question now is the extent to which these leads will be challenged between now and the May primaries.
